Other famous local connections include Henry Bell, originator of the steamship and John Logie Baird, the inventor of the television.

Helensburgh was named by The Times as one of the top 20 places to live by the sea in the United Kingdom in March 2017. For those candidates living in Glasgow and the area surrounding Helensburgh, the town offers fantastic transport links with a regular and direct train service into Glasgow Queen Street, Edinburgh Waverley and London Euston.




# **Job Description**

The person appointed will ideally be a well-qualified and experienced Matron; however, training will be considered for the right candidate. They will have enthusiasm and ensure the highest standards of care are given to the pupils at Lomond.

The role will be for 30 hrs, working over five days. Please note that these hours could be any day Monday to Sunday.

### The successful applicant will:

- Ideally have previous experience in a similar role in either a secondary school/college/industry
- Show sensitivity and objectivity in dealing with confidential issues
- While having a working knowledge of adolescent mental and physical health issues would be advantageous, it is not essential as professional training would be ongoing, in line with professional registration requirements
- Have the ability to work in a methodical manner and to prioritise their own workload to meet deadlines
- Have excellent interpersonal skills
- Be committed, flexible and well organised
- Have the ability to work effectively as part of a team, both locally and within the wider team
- Show willingness to research and attend training to further develop skills and keep abreast of new requirements





# **Job Responsibilities**

- To be an integral part of the pastoral care team at Burnbrae.
- To provide pastoral care in the form of being a listening ear for boarders. To share in their successes and setbacks.
- ·To be vigilant regarding and promoting the physical and emotional wellbeing of residents.
- ·To work with resident staff in providing a relaxed, supportive but disciplined environment.
- To be fully familiar with policies of the boarding house, in particular with the school's Child Protection Policy.
- ·To be familiar with the SSSC code of conduct.
- • To maintain an active CPD folder and to participate in In-service days and training opportunities as directed by the Pastoral Depute or medical staff. A particular emphasis is placed on the need for current training and certification in first aid, food hygiene and infection control.
- To promote the ethos of the house and to play a full part in its wider aims.
- ·To liaise closely with the school medical staff. To accompany boarders to appointments with doctors, dentists or opticians in Helensburgh and in Glasgow, and report to parents in writing.
- ·To dispense both prescription and non-prescription medication and to accurately record in collaboration with the school nurse.
- ·To perform housekeeping duties as directed by the Houseparent, ensuring public areas and residents' bedrooms are tidy.
- ·To accurately record information in house logs and diaries.
